3rd District Supervisor Ramos
Presents Regional MAC
Proposal at April 15 HVCC

James Ramos came to the meeting in Johnson Valley to talk about some new ideas for the formation of regional Municipal Advisory Councils.

MAC members are appointed by the Board of Supervisors to advise them on issues in unincorporated communities involving the County. The proposed plan would establish a basin-wide MAC that would include Morongo Valley, Wonder Valley, Joshua Tree and three of the Homestead Valley communities: Landers, Flamingo Heights and Yucca Mesa. Another regional MAC would represent Johnson Valley and Lucerne Valley.

Mixed reactions from the large audience was evidenced by the questions asked, and the statements that HVCC already acts as a channel of communication with not only the county, but also state and federal officials.

Reimbursement for Seniors'
Volunteer Driver/Escorts

Also at the April meeting, Kiosha Nelson of Valley Transportation Services described the TREP Transportation Reimbursement Escort Program and distributed brochures.

Under TREP, a volunteer driver/escort selected by an eligible senior or disabled person can be reimbursed by rider, 40¢ per mile, if the rider is in a San Bernardino County rural unincorporated area, disabled or frail, or unable to use other forms of transport for medical, banking or shopping.
